Special guest speakers Al & Dave Eicher will be here to talk about the real life story of Amelia Earhart's adventures in Michigan.

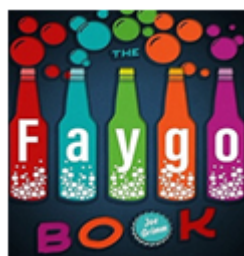


Book & Media Sale

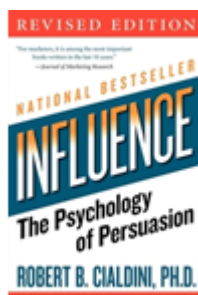


Book Talk: Irene Miller's *Into No Man's Land*

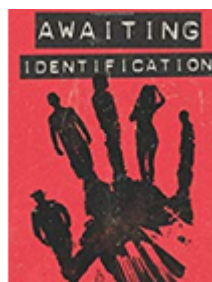


Film Showing: RBG
